## PASTOR'S LETTER

"For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it. "For you shall go out in joy and be led forth in peace; the mountains and the hills before you shall break forth into singing, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands." **-Isaiah 55:10–12** 

Have you ever heard a mountain sing? Have you ever seen a tree clap its hands? Probably not, and you probably never will, at least not on earth.

It sounds like symbolic language. It's intended to show us the outrageous goodness of the Word of God. It completely changes everything, even things that you wouldn't expect. The Word of God is so good that it can cause the mountains to sing and the trees to clap. It is so good that it always accomplishes the purposes for which God sends it.

That goodness is ours to receive. God has watched over and kept His Word for us through the centuries. We have it on our bookshelves. We have it on CDs and audio tapes. We have it on our TVs and radios. We have it on our phones and computers. More importantly, we live in a nation where we are free to gather as His people and hear, read, and study His Word. We can gather around His Word for worship and Sacraments. God generously shares His good Word with us. It gives us salvation and life.

That goodness is ours to share. God's Word is always effective, but how can people believe in what they haven't heard? And how can they hear unless someone proclaims it to them? We are called to bring the good news to the world. We are God's ambassadors; He speaks through us.

God's Word is outrageously good, and it is God's power for salvation. It changes us and gives us eternal life. Maybe in heaven we'll learn that it can also make mountains sing and trees clap their hands.

**Secretary's Report-** This was shared prior to the meeting electronically. Motion made to accept the report, motion seconded and motion passed.

**Treasurer's Report**- Finances are staying steady. For April netted \$880. Checking is looking good. As we enter Summer we encourage members to faithfully continue to make offerings, remembering that the ministry and other things keep going. Detailed financial reports available in the Office.

#### Pastor's Report:
